Social Distancing	Public, Anglers & Volunteers	Organisers to ensure the current Welsh Government regulations on social distancing is maintained: -  a) Follow venue specific procedures on entering & leaving the venue, including parking arrangements.  b) Follow venue specific procedures on use of toilets & other facilities c) Ensure pegs are at least 10m apart d) Compete & Go – no congregating before or after the match. e) No car sharing outside of your household f) No handshakes	Follow any venue specific procedures.			
Weighing-in catch or measurement of catch	Anglers & Volunteers	Organisers need to decide on their method of catch assessment: -  Sea Angling Measure & Release: -  Anglers take catch in a bucket of fresh sea water near to next angler. Fish to be measured & recorded on the match card. Measuring angler steps away, allowing the angler to collect the bucket & return the fish to the sea. Measuring angler to submit match card to organiser.  Sea Angling Rover Match: -  Weighing venue to be set up to allow for two officials to weigh & record the catch whilst maintaining social distance. Consider staggered times for anglers to present their catch to scales or a queue system at a safe distance.	Choose a method which is easiest to manage & maintain social distancing.  Consider what PPE will be required by officials & organisers whilst weighing catches.

		maintaining social distancing.				
		Loch Style Competitions: -				
		Additional time needs to be considered to allow				
		the phasing of start & finish times of the				
		competition to ensure social distancing can be				
		properly maintained. Boats must be able to ensure				
		that anglers are at least 2m apart. Organisers				
		should arrange a designated area for boats to wait				
		to disembark. This area should be marked to give				
		clear instructions to anglers				
		Organisers must ensure boats are cleaned				
		thoroughly after each separate use. Welsh				
		Government Guidance on sanitising procedures				
		should be followed.

PPE & Sanitisation	Public, Anglers & Volunteers	Organisers need to ensure they have adequate provisions of any PPE: -  a) Face coverings may be used by organisers, anglers & volunteers  b) Disposable gloves, apron & face coverings should be worn to administer First Aid.  c) Hand sanitiser – liquid is more cost effective than gel. Ask anglers to bring their own & have a supply available for organisers & officials.  d) Cleaning wipes to sanitise equipment & surfaces which meets Welsh Government guidance.  e) Rubbish bags – double bag all waste & dispose as the venue procedures dictate.	The Club Covid-19 Officer or other appointed official should oversee the competition, ensuring compliance with safety measures.
